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Heidegger-Latour Fusion

 most recognized philosopher of 20th century (Heidegger)

meets least-recognized (Latour)

Martin Heidegger (1889-1976)

- Strength
 - things not reducible to their relations
- Weaknesses
 - preserves dominance of human beings over all entities
 - specific entities treated mostly with contempt

Bruno Latour (b. 1947)

- Strengths
 - rejects dominance of human beings over all entities
 - specific actors treated on their own terms
- Weakness
 - things fully reduced to their relations

Heidegger and Latour Need Each Other's Strengths

- Heidegger's question of being:
 - things are always deeper than their presence

- Latour's actor-network theory:
 - human and nonhuman actors on equal footing

Heidegger's Fourfold Actor


Every Entity is Partly Hidden

 An Actor is in Tension with its Accidents and Relations


problem: apparently pompous, pseudopoetic terminology

Latour: The Plasma

"If Networks were the Size of the London Underground, the Plasma would be the remainder of London."

 strength: plasma accounts for sudden breakdowns in strong networks

 weakness: plasma seems unarticulated in its own right
